
## 2022 Medicare Part A and Part B Enrollment Periods Extended through End of Year

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services is providing equitable relief to individuals who could not submit premium-Part A or Part B enrollment or disenrollment requests timely due to challenges contacting them by phone. This relief applies to the 2022 General Enrollment Period, Initial Enrollment Period, and Special Enrollment Period.

If you were unable to enroll or disenroll in Medicare because you could not reach them by phone after January 1, 2022, you will be granted

additional time, through December 30, 2022.

# Do I need to sign up for Medicare at 65?

It depends on how you get your health How do I sign up for Medicare? you (or your spouse) work.

Generally, if you have job-based health insurance through your (or your spouse's) current job, you don't have to sign up for Medicare while you (or your spouse) are still working. You can wait to sign up until you (or your spouse) stop working or you lose your health insurance.



If you're self-employed or have health insurance that's not available to everyone at the company: Ask the insurance provider if your coverage is employer group health plan coverage (as defined by the IRS.) If it's not, sign up for Medicare when you turn 65 to avoid a monthly Part B late enrollment penalty...

- If the employer has less than 20 employees: You might need to sign up for Medicare when you turn 65 so you don't have gaps in your job-based health insurance. Check with the employer.
- If you have COBRA coverage: Sign up for in coverage and a monthly Part B late you need to sign up. COBRA will probably end once you sign have ESRD or ALS. up.

## Households Can Order Additional Free At-Home COVID-19 Tests

Residential households in the U.S. are now eligible for another order of free at-home tests on USPS.com. Here's what you need to know about your order:

- Each order now includes 8 rapid antigen COVID-19 tests
- Your order of 8 tests will come in 2 separate packages (4 tests in each package), each with its own tracking number
- Packages will ship free

If you need a COVID-19 test now, please see <a href="https://orchor.org/nc/esting-resources">other testing resources</a> for free testing locations in your area.

#### The tests available for order:

- Are rapid antigen at-home tests, not PCR
- Can be taken anywhere
- Give results within 30 minutes (no lab drop-off required)
- Work whether or not you have COVID-19 symptoms
- Work whether or not you are up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines
- Are also referred to as self-tests or over-thecounter (OTC) tests

## Get Tested for COVID-19 as soon as Possible

For many people, the sooner you act on your COVID-19 symptoms, the better! If you test positive — and are more likely to get very sick from COVID-19 — treatments are available to reduce your chances of severe illness.

Here's what you need to know:

Don't delay — get tested as soon as possible after your symptoms start. Treatment must be started within days after you first develop symptoms to be effective.

If you test positive, talk to your doctor or healthcare provider right away to find out if treatment is right for you, even if your symptoms are mild. There are multiple options for treating COVID-19 at home or in an outpatient setting.

### **COVID-19 Treatments**

If you're symptomatic, you may also want to consider using the <u>Test to Treat</u> program. With thousands of

locations nationwide, it can provide faster, easier access to lifesaving COVID-19 treatments. If you test positive, you can see a healthcare provider, and if eligible, get a prescription for an oral COVID-19 treatment and have that prescription filled — all at one location.
